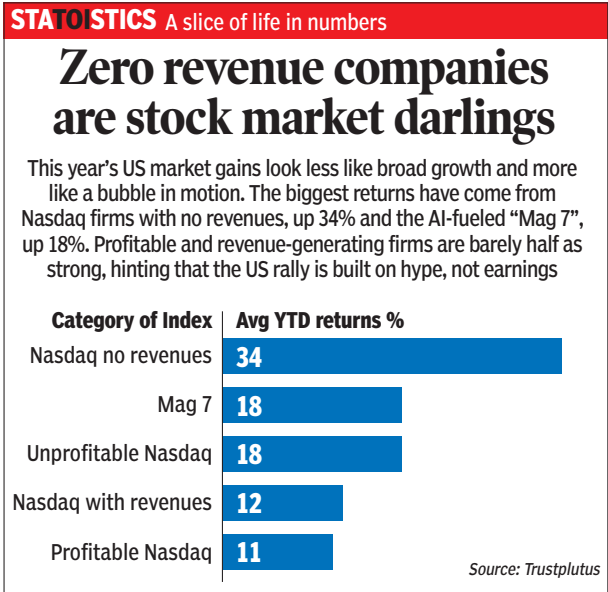

Haryana teen held hostage on 'dunki' route to US, killed

Jind: Smugglers shot dead a Haryana youth who was attempting to enter the US through the illegal "dunki" route after holding him captive in Guatemala, according to his family members.

Yuvraj (18), the only son of his parents, was from Mohna village in Pundri town of Kaithal district. He had left for the US on Oct 13, 2024. The family said they came to know about his fate last week after a death certificate sent by one of the smugglers, allegedly issued from Mexico, mentioned that he died on March 4, 2025, from a bullet injury.

Last year, agents had struck a Rs 41-lakh deal with Yuvraj's parents, assuring them payment would be taken after he reached his destination. They took a Rs 25 lakh in advance, said Yuvraj's father Kuldeep. Soon after, the family lost contact with him.

Some months later, they got videos showing Yuvraj and a youth from Punjab being held hostage in Guatemala. Smugglers could be seen

Teen kills mom, tries to mask it as a suicide

Bengaluru: A teenager, along with four friends, all minor boys, allegedly murdered her 34-year-old mother and staged it as a suicide at her residence in Bengaluru. The family of the 17-year-old class 9 dropout grew suspicious and alerted police, who got her to confess.

According to police, the girl and her friends murdered Netravathi after she filed a police complaint against them. "Four are aged between 16 and 17, and are school dropouts, while one is a 13-year-old boy in class 7, who is on the run," said a senior police officer.

Netravathi was opposed to her daughter's relationship with a 17-year-old. On Oct 20, the four juveniles went to the girl's house and assaulted Netravathi and her partner, Ravi Kumar. They allegedly threatened the couple and took Rs 15,000. Netravathi then went to the police. On Oct 25, the teens allegedly strangled her with a towel. They then hanged the body from the fan with a sari. TNN

Mill belt severs woman's head in front of kids

Bijnor: A 34-year-old woman died Thursday while grinding flour after her dupatta got caught in the belt of a makeshift mill at her home, pulling her into the machine, reports **Harveer Dabas**. The impact was so severe that Manoj Devi's head was severed from her body.

The horrifying accident in Amroha's Kalali village occurred in front of her two children, aged five and nine. Hearing their cries, her mother-in-law rushed to the spot and found her lying in a pool of blood.

Devi's husband, Narendra Kumar, who works as a driver, was away at the time.

Dhanaura SHO Balendra Yadav said an autopsy had been conducted and the report was awaited. "An investigation is under way, but police are yet to receive a complaint," he added.

Devi used to grind flour for neighbours for a small fee. Her last rites were performed after police handed over the body.

Col faces axe for stealing affection of a brother officer's wife

Chandigarh: An Army General Court Martial (GCM) has recommended dismissal of a colonel for having an "improper relationship" with the wife of another colonel.

The officer is from Corps of Electronics and Mechanical Engineers and has served an infantry attachment with the elite 21 Para SF. He has also completed his staff course.

The court martial—headed by a major general-rank officer and with six colonels as members—began proceedings in May and findings were given Wednesday. Sources said the colonel was found guilty of three of the four charges levelled against him under various provisions of Army Act.

Two of the charges were that he stayed with the other colonel's wife at hotels in Haridwar in Sept 2021, and Dehradun in April 2022. The third charge was that he, while in the field, fraudulently used a genuine dependent card of another colonel's wife as that of his wife in Sept 2021 and April 2022. GCM recommended his dismissal, subject to approval of higher Army authorities. TNN

No lawyer wants to take on Asaram, says survivor dad

Bareilly: Days after Rajasthan HC granted interim bail to Asaram Babu—serving a life sentence for raping a minor—on medical grounds, the girl's father said he would challenge it in Supreme Court but no advocate was willing to take the case as the self-styled godman wielded enormous influence, reports **Krishna Chaudhary**. He said his family was facing threats from Asaram's followers. He told TOI, "Since I got this news, we are living in fear.. Whenever I speak to any lawyer about the case, he or she says no." He added, "Asaram's followers are keeping a watch on us."

Can't quiz lawyer on client's crimes: SC

'No Immunity If Lawyer Complicit In Crime, Or Is In-House Counsel'

New Delhi: Quoting a US judgment that said harassing lawyers is a step in the direction of a totalitarian form of govt, Supreme Court on Friday said no investigating agency could issue summons to an advocate for questioning merely because they gave legal opinion, advice or represented a person accused of committing a serious crime or huge financial irregularity.

A bench of CJI B R Gavai and Justices K Vinod Chandran and N V Anjaria stressed an advocate could not be coerced into revealing any information with respect to the client they represented or the cause they were engaged to prosecute or defend. "Such privilege extends to legal opinions given by an advocate to individuals, corporates, firms and associations," it said.

SC had taken suo motu cognizance of the issuance of summons to advocates by probe agencies and police. Writing the judgment, Justice Chandran, however, said immunity from disclosing privileged advocate-client communication was not available to in-house counsel who were in regular employment of a corporate entity with full salaries, as they were not included within the definition of advocates under the Advocates Act, 1961.

The court also clarified that immunity from summons did not apply to advocates who had assisted or conspired with the client in the commission of a crime.

The bench said when summons in such instances was issued to an advocate, the investigating officer must take the consent of a superior officer not below the rank of SP. All such summonses can be challenged in courts, SC said.

Referring to Bhartiya Sakhya Adhiniyam provisions, the bench said client-lawyer communication had been treated as sacrosanct

and no authority could seek details. It, however, refrained from framing guidelines on issuance of summons, saying there was no legal vacuum that required judicial intervention.

"The role of lawyers in society and the discharge of their duties...in establishing rights or defending against infringements cannot at all be discounted," SC said, though conceding there were black sheep "who tread the uneven, muddy lanes of deceit, in purported protection of interest of the client".

It said, "The provision providing protection to the privileged communications between the lawyer and the client is not to protect those deviants but to ensure that the vast majority, who are day in and day out involved in the task of administration of justice, are not victimised or bullied into making disclosures of their communications with their clients, merely for reason of having represented a client of questionable conduct..."

SC provided for a trial court-monitored mechanism for production of electronic devices of an advocate in an instance where they were complicit in a crime but barred disclosure of any communication between that advocate and their other clients unrelated to the crime.

Since both are probe agencies, how can ED force police to act on its findings, asks HC

Chennai: How can Enforcement Directorate, being an investigating agency itself, approach court for a direction to the Tamil Nadu police, which is another investigating agency, to register cases based on information it provided regarding alleged illegal sand mining in the state, Madras high court asked on Friday.

The first bench of Chief Justice Manindra Mohan Shrivastava and Justice G Arul Murugan made the observation on a plea moved by ED seeking directions to the TNDGP to register FIRs in respect of cognizable offences disclosed under Section 66(2) of PMLA through communications dated June 13, 2024, and July 18, 2024.

Responding to the query, ED submitted that PMLA allowed it to request other agencies to act upon its findings. Opposing the plea, TN advocate general P S Raman contended that state police could not be treated as a "post office" to merely act on ED's letters. He pointed out that states like UP, Bihar and Gujarat had four times as many sand mining cases as TN, yet ED had not taken any action there.

To this, ED submitted the petition was filed only in pub-

lic interest and having collected this much evidence, it was concerned that the material not be wasted. Responding to the argument, the AG said, "If public interest is the basis, can the Tamil Nadu govt similarly approach Gujarat high court seeking action on illegal sand mining in the state?"

A similar case was filed by ED before Supreme Court against the Delhi govt, in which SC asked the agency under what right it had approached the court with such a prayer. Subsequently, the additional solicitor general said he did not want any findings from the court and withdrew the petition, Raman said.

Since the AG submitted that the state was ready to inform the court about the future course of action through a counter affidavit, HC adjourned the hearing for 3 weeks.
