Two held for beating man to death over 'stolen' auto

New Delhi: Two auto rickshaw drivers have been arrested for allegedly fatally thrashing a man in south Delhi's RK Puram after he was caught driving an auto-rickshaw claimed to be stolen. Police said the accused wanted to "teach him a lesson."

According to police, information was received in early June regarding a man found in an unconscious state near Hanuman Mazdoor Camp, Sector-4, RK Puram.

A police team rushed to the spot and learned that the man had been severely beaten. He was later identified as Raj Kumar, 45, a resident of Madanpur Khadar, who was admitted to Safdarjung Hospital by his son. He succumbed to his injuries during treatment.

Investigations revealed that Kumar had been driving a stolen three-wheeler shared rickshaw that had gone missing from Sector-3, RK Puram on the night of May 30. An FIR was registered.

"On the night of June 1, an auto driver spotted the missing vehicle at a CNG pump in Sarojini Nagar, allegedly being driven by Raj Kumar. With the help of other drivers, he apprehended the victim and informed Sushil Kumar, the cousin of the vehicle owner. Sushil, along with his friend, Amit, then brought Raj Kumar to Hanuman Mazdoor Camp where he was allegedly beaten," DCP Amit Goel said.

Based on footage from various CCTV cameras, local intelligence and witness statements, four persons were first apprehended. They named Sushil (22) and Amit (19) as key perpetrators, following which both fled.

"A team was formed and, after weeks of surveillance, both were arrested from RK Puram on July 24. The stolen three-wheeler shared rickshaw was also recovered at Amit's instance," DCP Goel added.

Police said Raj Kumar had a criminal background and was listed as a "bad character" in the records of Badarpur police station.

A case under Section 105 (culpable homicide) of Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS) has been registered. Police have said that further investigation in the case is underway.

The stations progressively went on the blink till the whole network went down on April 2.

On days when the IMD stations don't record air quality because of glitches or other reasons, the state has no pollution data. This happened in Gurgaon for several days this month when the IMD station in Gwalpahari wasn't working.

A tender floated in May 2025 for an operator drew only one bidder. The bid was automatically disqualified under govt's procurement rules that require at least two bidders for competitive selection. According to officials, the second round of tenders is still being prepared and is expected to be issued this week with a late-Aug deadline for submissions.

Once bids are received, a lengthy evaluation follows. The process involves technical scrutiny, financial review, clearance by a high-powered committee and finally approval from the chief minister's office. That, according to officials, could take 60 to 90 days. That means Haryana could enter peak smog season without real-time AQI data, without which there can be no alerts, no enforcement and no public warnings. (These are all critical to Grap (graded response action plan), which usually comes into force from Oct 15.)

"There should have been a contingency plan. Even if you want to bring in a new vendor, you don't shut off surveillance entirely. That's like switching off CCTV in a high-crime zone because you are changing the camera vendor," a senior HSPCB official admitted.

Sunil Dahiya, founder and lead analyst at Envirocatalysts, emphasised the importance of timely administrative decisions on bids for new contracts. "Decisions on opening bids for new contracts for govt services are usually planned well before the existing one ends, especially for maintaining such critical infrastructure as air quality monitoring in a state like Haryana, which lies in one of the most polluted areas. It's unfortunate that this happened, but it should serve as a reminder

to plan better for the future and for other states," he said.

Asked about it, HSPCB chairman Vineet Garg said the board has changed certain conditions in the tender and will be floating it by the end of July.

While Grap's implementation is based on Delhi's AQI data, anti-pollution measures are enforced in all NCR cities after analysing indices recorded by local air monitors.

"This blackout is likely to have serious consequences. Winter is the most polluted time of year in Haryana, with air quality often slipping into 'very poor' or 'severe' category due to stagnant weather, crop residue burning and fossil fuel emissions. Without functioning monitors, district authorities can't track local AQI levels, identify pollution spikes, decide when to implement pollution curbs," said Shubhansh Tiwari, research associate at Centre for Science and Environment (CSE), adding that the state would essentially be forced to rely on Delhi data.

The implication goes beyond Grap. Under National Clean Air Programme

(NCAP) and its state-specific pollution control action plans, govt must track, report and demonstrate year-on-year improvements in air quality, all of which are data-dependent.

Manoj Kumar, an analyst at Centre for Research on Energy and Clean Air (CREA),

information affects both public awareness and the ability to evaluate policy response," Kumar added. The two monitors in Gurgaon and Panchkula cover just a fraction of the state's urban and industrial landscape. "You can't extrapolate Delhi's air to Karnal or Hisar," said a senior officer who is part of the clean air programme. "The pollution sources, local weather patterns, and emissions vary. A single reading from Gurgaon tells you nothing about what's happening in Yamunanagar or Panipat," he said. For that matter, a station in one part of a large city won't even capture the picture in another part of it.

A study of the air quality data by CREA found that Jan 19, 2025, was Gurgaon's "over-shoot day". By then, PM 2.5 concentration was already so high that even if levels were to drastically reduce to zero for the rest of the year, the city would still fail to meet the acceptable limit specified by World Health Organisation (WHO). The analysis ranked Gurgaon as the fifth most polluted Indian city in the first half of 2025.

20-year-old who slipped into coma after BMW hit-&-run dies

Noida: Two days after a five-year-old girl died after a BMW car, allegedly driven by a student under the influence of alcohol, crashed into a scooter near the Sector 30 govt hospital, her 20-year-old uncle succumbed to his injuries.

According to police, Raza suffered fractures to his head, leg and hands. He had slipped into a coma during treatment. He was being treated at a private hospital in Ghaziabad since Saturday midnight after the accident. He died late on Sunday.

On Sunday, his five-year-old niece Ayaat had died in a hit-and-run incident before she could be taken to a hospital. Her father Gul Mohammad, also injured in the accident, continues to remain under observation at a private hospital in Sector 20.

The accident was reported a little after Saturday midnight, near gate number 3 of Child PGI Hospital. The child had complained of an earache and was nauseous earlier in that evening and was taken to the hospital for a checkup by her father and uncle. The three were returning home around 12.20am.

Police said that Gul, a plumber, approached a U-turn near the hospital from the wrong side on his scooter when the BMW rammed it. Passersby, who alerted cops on the emergency helpline number, had claimed the impact of the collision was so severe that the scooter was dragged for about 100 metres.

Driver held for hit & run that injured NSG man, had dozed off

New Delhi: A 30-year-old driver has been arrested by Delhi Police in a hit-and-run case for allegedly seriously injuring a National Security Guard (NSG) personnel after dozing off at the wheel. The accused was apprehended from his residence in Rajokri.

According to police, a PCR call was received at 6am on July 9 reporting that a man had been hit by a vehicle on the service road of RTR Marg in RK Puram. The victim, identified as Narender Singh, a serving NSG personnel, was on a morning walk when the incident occurred. He was rushed to AIIMS Trauma Centre with serious injuries.

An FIR was registered under Sections 281 (rash driving or riding on a public way) and 125 (act endangering life or personal safety of others) of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS), and a team was formed to investigate. DCP (south-west) Amit Goel said CCTV footage helped trace the vehicle to Hapur, UP. The vehicle's owner informed police that he had given the car to his driver, identified as Pawan Kumar Chauhan.

Chauhan, a resident of Rajokri village in Vasant Kunj, initially went off the grid. His mobile phone was last active near Noida, and CCTV cameras later tracked the vehicle to Sector-67, Noida, after

which it became untraceable. Through sustained surveillance, photo circulation among informers, and technical tracking, police received a tip-off on July 24 and located Chauhan at his Rajokri residence. He was arrested along with the vehicle involved in the incident.

his family and allegedly fell asleep while driving due to exhaustion. After hitting the NSG jawan, he panicked and fled the scene, ignoring his family's pleas to stop. He dropped his children off at Rajokri and fled to Noida in an attempt to evade arrest.

Since 2023, about 1,500 people have lost their lives in hit-and-run cases across the capital, revealed Delhi Police data. While 666 people were killed in 2023, the toll stood at 644 in 2024 and 190 till April 30, 2025. The data also showed that on a daily average, two persons were killed in 1,481 fatal crashes.
